

Helena Romanes Sixth Form Dress Code



The Helena Romanes School and Sixth Form has the ethos that Sixth Form students are role models for younger students in the school. Sixth Form students are young adults and therefore operate differently to students in the main school but still form part of the Helena Romanes community.

The School expects Sixth Form students to wear clothing that is both comfortable for working throughout the day and appropriate for an educational environment. Dress should be smart-casual, appropriate for school and safe for the environment that students work in.

We ask all students to abide by the following rules:

- No clothing with inappropriate/offensive logos, images or texts
- No sportswear (with the exception of HRS BTEC sports kit and A-level dancewear). This includes jogging bottoms, replica shirts such as football shirts and gym wear
- Hats are not permitted in the school building and hoods should not be up when in school
- Shorts, skirts, dresses and other items worn should be mid-thigh length or longer
- Shoulders and midriff should be covered throughout the day
- Beachwear and flip flops are not appropriate
- Tattoos must not be visible
- Any facial piercings must be discussed with Mr Cooke and Mrs Wright and will be at their discretion

We ask that all students take responsibility in their dress to make sure they look smart, casual and comfortable.

This is not an exhaustive list in defining acceptable and unacceptable standards of dress and appearance. The final decision of what constitutes appropriate dress is at the discretion of The Director of Sixth Form and Head of Sixth Form.

If there is a concern raised regarding the dress code from your Form Tutor or subject teacher, you will be asked to visit Mr Cooke or Mrs Wright.
